10:30am – 11:30am	G	Under the Radar: Tuning in to the Mental Health Needs of High-Achieving StudentsSpeakers: Laura Horne,Riverview B (Hilton Baton Rouge Capitol Center, 201 Lafayette, Baton Rouge, LA 70801)MPH, CHESActive Minds was founded by Alison Malmon when she was a junior at the University of Pennsylvania following the suicide of her older brother, and only sibling, Brian.
		Brian Malmon was a smart, popular, and fun student through high school and college. In the beginning of his freshman year at Columbia University, he started struggling with depression and psychosis, but concealed his symptoms from everyone around him for three years. His depression was left untreated and only worsened as he continued to hide his distress from his friends.
		Alison recognized that Brian's story is the story of thousands of young people who suffer in silence; who, despite their large numbers, think they are totally alone. A majority of mental illnesses start between ages 14 and 24 when teens and young adults are in school, and suicide is the second leading cause of death for college students.
		Allison wanted to combat the stigma of mental illness, encourage students who needed help to seek it early, and prevent future tragedies like the one that took her brother's life. She created her own student-to-student model and formed a student group then known as Open Minds. The group's number one goal was to spread the word that seeking help is a sign of strength and not something to be ashamed of.
		Within two years, as the number of chapters continued to increase and a national office was established in Washington, DC. The new nonprofit organization and all of the affiliated campus chapters were renamed Active Minds to reflect the organization's focus on action and student advocacy in mental health. Active Minds was incorporated as a 501(c)3 organization in late 2003.
